WY-TOPP Reports

At parent-teacher conferences in October we will give you your child's first quarter report card and their Individual Student Report from last year's **WY-TOPP** testing. Your child's date of birth may be wrong on that ISR, but the testing data on the sheet is accurate.

ASVAB Testing

All juniors will participate in ASVAB testing on **October 16**. This testing assists us with our end of year school accountability and also provides your student with valuable career related information including possible career fields that match their areas of strength.

Open Gym Time

Open gym or rec board time is from 6:30—9:00 Mon. Thurs. depending on our home event schedule. We cannot allow the community to use our facility outside this time. Please come in and take advantage of our weight room and gym area during our regularly scheduled open gym times.

This year MVHS will continue using **Academic Honor Time** as a resource for students to use time during their day to complete necessary work. This year AHT will be after second period and before lunch. We experimented with this schedule last April and May and feel like it gives us the biggest opportunity to help students complete the work they need to get done.

This year we are running AHT on Tuesdays, Wednesday, and Thursday. Lunch starts on those days at 11:35. By cutting a passing time short, shaving four minutes off of lunch, and shortening classes by five minutes, we are able to have this 27 minute structured time where students can receive additional time and support on their work. Some students are able to work on the schoolwork of their choice, while some are directed into a specific teacher's class to complete their work.

Last year I heard from numerous parents that they don't know if their student has homework, and if a student is involved in activities they may miss a certain teacher for several classes in a row. With our use of Academic Honor Time, all students now have a structured time during their school day where they can get caught up in their classes and get work done. If your student has a D or F grade ask them how they are using Honor Time to get caught up in that course. Academic Honor Time is an excellent way for your child to stay caught up with their schoolwork despite their busy schedules.

ACT Reimbursement!

Don't forget that if you have a **9th, 10th, or 11th** grade student and they take the ACT test prior to the statewide testing date their junior year, **you are eligible for a one-time cost of the ACT test reimbursement.**

We would encourage any student to take the ACT test at least one time prior to the statewide testing date as that first test provides so much information about the actual testing process.

No Weapons on Campus

According to Wyoming statute, hunting weapons are considered a Type I weapon and the penalty for possession of a Type I weapons on school grounds is **expulsion** for not less than one year.

Do not allow your child to keep any hunting weapons and ammunition in their vehicle if they are coming

onto school grounds.

Please emphasize to your child the importance of safety at this time of year. Take the time to be sure all hunting weapons are out of student-driven vehicles, secured, and off campus.

No person - even someone with a concealed carry permit—is allowed to have

a weapon on campus in Uinta County School District #4.
