## Hathaway Scholarship

Hathaway offers four individual scholarships and a need-based scholarship that can supplement these merit-based awards.

**Honors-** \$1,680 for 8 full-time semesters

**25 ACT 3.5 GPA**

4 years of English, 4 years of math, 3 years of social studies, 4 years of science, 4 years of either fine and performing arts, foreign language or career and technical education. **2 of the 4 years must be sequenced**

**Performance-** \$1,260 for 8 full-time semesters

**21 ACT 3.0 GPA**

4 years of English, 4 years of math, 3 years of social studies, 4 years of science, and 4 years of either fine and performing arts, foreign language or career and technical education. **2 of the 4 years must be sequenced**

**Opportunity-** \$840 for 8 full-time semesters

**19 ACT 2.5 GPA**

4 years of English, 4 years of math, 3 years of social studies, and 4 years of science, 2 years of either fine and performing arts, career and technical education, or foreign language (FL must be sequenced)

**Provisional-** \$840-4 full-time semesters at a community college.

**17 ACT 2.5 GPA**

4 years of English, 3 years of math

\*if proficient, 3 years of social studies, and 3 years of science, 2 years of either fine and performing arts, career and technical education, or foreign language (FL must be sequenced)



**SENIORS****Checklist for October**

- ◇ Register for the December ACT (in Evanston or Lyman) if you need to.
  - ◇ Request applications, financial aid and other information from schools.
  - ◇ Search for private or national scholarships over the internet and look for e-mails from Mrs. Hauf.
  - ◇ Talk with college representatives when they visit the school.
  - ◇ Explore college websites for schools you are interested in.
- Remember to have four colleges in mind, a reach school, two schools you are comfortable with, and a safety net school.

**NCAA Reminders**

**9th Grade:** Make sure you are taking NCAA approved classes.

**10th Grade:** Register with NCAA at [eligibilitycenter.org](http://eligibilitycenter.org)

**11th Grade:** Make sure you will graduate with the required number of NCAA core courses. Take the ACT or SAT. Have high school counselor upload your transcript to NCAA Eligibility Center.

**12th Grade:** Complete NCAA core courses. Take ACT and send scores to NCAA (code 9999). Apply to schools, request final amateurism certification beginning April 1st. Have high school counselor upload final high school transcript to NCAA.

## 9<sup>TH</sup> GRADE



- *Start planning now!* Take the right courses and earn the best grades possible.
- Find your high school's list of NCAA-approved core courses at [eligibilitycenter.org/courselist](https://eligibilitycenter.org/courselist).
- Sign up for a free Profile Page account at [eligibilitycenter.org](https://eligibilitycenter.org) for information on NCAA requirements.

## 10<sup>TH</sup> GRADE

REGISTER



- If you fall behind academically, ask your counselor for help finding approved courses you can take.
- Register for a Profile Page account or Certification account with the NCAA Eligibility Center at [eligibilitycenter.org](https://eligibilitycenter.org).
- Monitor your Eligibility Center account for next steps.
- At the end of the year, ask your counselor at each high school or program you attended to upload your official transcript to your Eligibility Center account.

## 11<sup>TH</sup> GRADE



- Check with your counselor to make sure you are on track to complete the required number of NCAA-approved courses and graduate on time with your class.
- Take the SAT/ACT and submit your scores to the Eligibility Center using code 9999. More information regarding the impact of COVID-19 and test scores can be found at [on.ncaa.com/COVID19\\_Fall\\_E](https://on.ncaa.com/COVID19_Fall_E).
- Ensure your sports participation information is correct in your Eligibility Center account.
- At the end of the year, ask your counselor at each high school or program you attended to upload your official transcript to your Eligibility Center account.

## 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE



- Complete your final NCAA-approved core courses as you prepare for graduation.
- Take the SAT/ACT again, if necessary, and submit your scores to the Eligibility Center using code 9999. More information regarding the impact of COVID-19 and test scores can be found at [on.ncaa.com/COVID19\\_Fall\\_E](https://on.ncaa.com/COVID19_Fall_E).
- Request your final amateurism certification beginning April 1 (fall enrollees) or Oct. 1 (winter/spring enrollees) in your Eligibility Center account at [eligibilitycenter.org](https://eligibilitycenter.org).
- After you graduate, ask your counselor to upload your final official transcript with proof of graduation to your Eligibility Center account.
- **Reminder:** Only students on an NCAA Division I or II school's institutional request list will receive a certification.
