ACT Reminder: the next ACT is in December, and registration is closed. The next ACT date is February 11, 2022, but it is not at MVHS. If your student wants to test they will need to create an ACT account at myact.org and register to test. There is an ACT at MVHS on June 10 and registration is open.

All sophomores were recently presented with Hathaway Scholarship information, college athletics (NCAA, NAIA), and graduation requirements in World History. They then calculated what level of the Hathaway Scholarship they were on track for and planned the courses they would need to take to continue on that path. I encourage you to talk to your sophomore about their scholarship eligibility.

Juniors went to the K8 and put on a college fair for students. They researched Wyoming colleges and presented that information to students in grades 2-8th. They presented the cost of college, scholarships, majors, and more. They all did a fantastic job.

1. Start with in-state colleges or universities. These schools are usually more accessible and offer Wyoming-specific scholarships and in-state tuition.
2. Move to out-of-state options once you know the sticker price for in-state schools so you can compare costs.
3. Ask the right questions (see below).
4. Go visit any potential college and get a feel for the campus, environment, and town. Seniors receive two free college visit passes. See Mrs. Hauf for more information.

- What financial aid opportunities or resources are available here?
- Are there student loans available?
- Are there programs for first-generation students?
- What is your graduation rate?
- Do you have study-abroad opportunities?
- What resources are available to students on your campus?
- What is the deadline to commit to your institution?
