#### **NCAA** Reminders

9th Grade: Make sure you are taking NCAA approved classes.

10th Grade: Register with NCAA at eligibilitycenter.org

11th Grade: Make sure you will graduate with the required number of NCAA core courses. Take the ACT or SAT. Have high school counselor upload your transcript to NCAA Eligibility Center. 12th Grade: Complete NCAA core courses. Take ACT and send scores to NCAA (code 9999). Apply to schools, request final amateurism certification beginning April 1st. Have high school counselor upload final high school transcript to NCAA.

### **Hathaway Scholarship**

Hathaway offers four individual scholarships and a need-based scholarship that can supplement these merit-based awards.

Honors- \$1,680 for 8 full-time semesters

25 ACT 3.5 GPA

4 years of English, 4 years of math, 3 years of social studies, 4 years of science, 4 years of either fine and performing arts, foreign language or career and technical education. 2 of the 4 years must be sequenced

Performance-\$1,260 for 8 full-time semesters

21 ACT 3.0 GPA

4 years of English, 4 years of math, 3 years of social studies, 4 years of science, and 4 years of either fine and performing arts, foreign language or career and technical education. 2 of the 4 years must be sequenced

Opportunity-\$840 for 8 full-time semesters

19 ACT 2.5 GPA

4 years of English, 4 years of math, 3 years of social studies, and 4 years of science, 2 years of either fine and performing arts, career and technical education, or foreign language (FL must be sequenced)

Provisional- \$840-4 full-time semesters at a community college.

# 9th REGISTER



- » Start planning now! Register for a free Profile Page account at eligibilitycenter.org for information on NCAA initial-eligibility requirements.
- » Find your high school's list of NCAA-approved core courses at eligibilitycenter.org/courselist to ensure you are taking the right courses, and earn the best grades possible!

# 10th PLAN

- » If you are being actively recruited by an NCAA school and have a Profile Page account, transition it to the right Certification account.
- » Monitor the task list in your NCAA Eligibility Center account for next steps.
- » At the end of the school year, ask your high school counselor from each school you have attended to upload an official transcript to your Eligibility Center account.
- » If you fall behind academically, ask your high school counselor for help finding approved courses you can take.

# 11th STUDY



- » Ensure your sports participation information is correct in your Eligibility Center account.
- » Check with your high school counselor to make sure you are on track to complete the required number of NCAA-approved core courses and graduate on time with your class.
- » Take the SAT/ACT and submit your scores to the Eligibility Center using code 9999.\*
- » At the end of the school year, ask your high school counselor from each school you have attended to upload an official transcript to your Eligibility Center account.

# 12th GRADUATE



- » Request your final amateurism certification beginning April 1 (fall enrollees) or Oct. 1 (winter/spring enrollees) in your Eligibility Center account at eligibilitycenter.org.
- » Take the SAT/ACT again, if necessary, and submit your scores to the Eligibility Center using code 9999.\*
- » Complete your final NCAA-approved core courses as you prepare for graduation.
- » After you graduate, ask your high school counselor to upload your final official transcript with proof of graduation to your Eligibility Center account.
