- Applicants going on a mission or serving in the military; this scholarship will be held for 24 months. The applicant needs to provide deferment notice in writing.
- All scholarship money will be written out to the recipient. If attending a trade school, the recipient will receive the full amount. Attendance at a University or Junior college, one check will be written at the beginning of each consecutive semester after proof of enrollment has been provided.
