Junior Parents:

Talk to your student about any career paths that may have come out of taking the ASVAB. They will have their test results as well as a career booklet to give them a starting place. We will have an interpretation of their results during English 11. This is a conversation starter to help them start thinking about their plan after high school. All colleges have net price calculators. Have your student look at colleges they are interested in attending and see the approximate cost, this can be a real eye-opener. We have college visits during AHT. They are in our daily announcements.

Sophomore and Freshmen Parents:

Make sure you are reminding your students about how critical it is to pass all classes. Eight absences in a single class will result in a loss of credit, so the class will need to be repeated. They need to understand they need all classes for graduation. Continue to remind students how important their GPA is for scholarships and admission into college. It's harder to build up a GPA than to start strong and maintain it.

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Housekeeping

- ♦ Seniors: December 1st, is a <u>priority deadline</u> for many colleges, specifically for some <u>scholarships</u>. Seniors need to make sure they have applied, requested high school transcripts from Mrs. Hauf, and have received a provisional acceptance letter from colleges they are applying to. One in particular is the University of Wyoming and the **Trustees' Scholarship**. If you are unsure of your admittance status, please reach out to the University of Wyoming's Office of Admissions.
- ♦ University of Wyoming Cowboy Commitment Scholarship Update:
 Students who apply any time from now until May 1 will be reviewed for Cowboy Commitment. New this year, students who take the ACT exam after they have been accepted will be reviewed to see if they could possibly move up to a higher level. Also, UW will review their final unweighted cumulative high school GPA to see if it increases for any possible upgrade. Please note this excludes Trustees' Scholars candidates because they must have their ACT score in by December 1.
- ♦ Athletes: remember to look into registration for NCAA or NAIA. If you have questions talk to Mrs. Hauf.
- ♦ All Students: look at or create a long-term plan of the classes you are going to take from MVHS. If you want to create a long-term plan with Mrs. Hauf come in and we will create one!
- ♦ Schedule changes for Semester 2: if your student needs a schedule change for semester two, please have them see the email that was sent to all students. They need to communicate with Mr. Carr.
- ♦ Saturday School: November 11th, 8-12 and November 18th, 8-12.
- ♦ ACT reimbursement: any student who takes the ACT before their State ACT test Junior year, can be reimbursed. Call or come see Mrs. Hauf for more information. This is a great opportunity to experience the ACT.
